Minutes of the Public Meeting

February 7, 2006

Members present: Mike Lamarre, Debbie Bouley

Public Hearing – Water and Wastewater Fees

Hearing opened at 7:00 pm

M. Lamarre opened the hearing stating that the town is going to add a new fee, one for refusal to allow inspection of connections at \$250 per billing cycle and the other to change the fee for tie-ins to water and sewer lines to \$3,000 for each. He stated that State has told the town that the fee is still low comparable to others in the state. M. Lamarre explained what this fee is used for, to cover the cost for installation of new lines. C. Buttrick questioned the number of homes that can connect to the wastewater system. M. Lamarre stated that the number is not certain at this time as the town still has a problem with infiltration that needs to be corrected. C. Deane asked what the results of the I&I study brought. Board explained what has been found to this date and future plans. C. Deane asked what the new contract was for with Woodard & Curran. Board stated that it was a 5 year contract with 3 months pull out time. She also asked if the town considered running it themselves. Board explained that they were not able to come up with anything at this time but will continue to look into it.

Hearing closed at 7:12 p.m.

Public Hearing – 2007 Budget

Hearing opened at 7:13 pm

Board went over the 2007 Operating Budgets for General Fund, Water, Wastewater and Revenues. Charles Buttrick noted that the Forest Fire Budget was not what had been submitted, they had requested level funding and the \$640 for training was omitted. Board agreed to insert that amount into that line item and changed the bottom line of the budget.

Other Business

Adams Hill Water Tank & Chemical feed pump at Water Plant

Linda advised the Board that she spoke with Rick Skarinka of DES concerning the water tank on Adams Hill. He advised her that the town would need to have an engineer draw up specifications for either a new tank or for repairs. He is willing to come and meet with the Board to discuss the town's options. R. Skarinka also discussed the dirty water issue in town and stated that the town should not be adding chemicals but increasing hydrant flushing. Board will invite Mr. Skarinka to a meeting to discuss both issues further.

Lagoons

Board received a price for the clean out of the lagoons at the water plant. This cost was more than anticipated. Paul Roux told the Board that the other alternative is to look into doing the work ourselves. This will be discussed more in depth at the meeting on February 28.
