

**Greenville Board of Selectmen**  
**Minutes of the Public Meeting**  
**August 8, 2007**

Members present: Debbie Bouley, Mike Lamarre, Scott Blease

Meeting opened at 7:00 p.m.

**Bob Mac Arthur – Youth Center**

An informational survey regarding a Youth Center was presented to the Board. B. MacArthur stated his idea to provide a youth facility for Greenville, New Ipswich, Mason, and Temple because of lack of place to go and gather for the children in the community. He explained that grant money for a Youth Center is available, but for now he is trying to find out how much interest there is in the community and looking for support before continuing. He looked at two buildings in New Ipswich, but both of them are non functional. He suggested his idea about forming a joint Committee between the four towns to work on this.

R. Miller added Greenville Parks and Rec. Committee had a discussion with B. Mac Arthur about the possibility having such a place and passed the motion. He thought geographically Greenville would be an ideal location to have this place.

Board supported the idea to have a Youth Center in the area and asking B. Mac Arthur to give them more information.

A. McInnis informed the Board that the Highway Department did a great job on the walking path and they should get recognition. She said the speed bumps are working good and making people drive very slowly. Some concerns about the safety of the children arose and suggestions were made to talk to the lifeguards about the situation at the pool and to make sure that they are aware if there is a suspicious situation. A. McInnis said a Police Officer often drives around the park for a regular check.

**Rick Miller – Pool Repairs**

R. Miller said after learning that the pool in Peterborough is a lot older than Greenville's pool, he thought a replacement might not be the current concern. He explained that the pool has six skimmers with two of them barely functioning, three of them are somewhat working, and they are not pulling the water out completely. Also, two bottom drains are not working. He questioned if the money in the Trustees of Trust Funds account for pool repairs and improvement could be used for this purpose. The Board said as of this date there is \$24,832.48 available and could be used to repair the pool. R. Miller said he would like to get an estimate to repair the pipes to fix the problem. He has contacted a pipeline service company in Maine that fixed the pool in Peterborough, but turned out the Greenville Town Pool has two inch pipe and is too small for that company to work with. He also received an estimate of \$15,000 from another company to dig up and repair the

pipes. Board asked him to get three estimates for the repairs and report back to the Board before proceeding.

**Marcel Bernier – Emergency Management**

M. Bernier asked the Board to sign a grant application from the State to get reimbursement of 50% of the total price to purchase a laptop. He explained he would like to put chemical and contact information in the laptop and thought that during the emergency situation this could be very helpful. He presented four quotes and decided to buy from the company with the cheapest quote of \$1,800 which included all components needed. Board signed the application.

M. Bernier said that he would like to send a form for the pre-disaster mitigation which would allow the Town to know the cost. Board had no objection. He also informed the Board if they would like to attend the Dam meeting that is going to be held in the Greenville Fire Station on Tuesday, August 14 at 7:00 p.m.
