

Greenville Board of Selectmen
Minutes of the Public Meeting
November 28, 2007

Members present: Debbie Bouley, Mike Lamarre, Scott Blease

Meeting opened at 7:00 p.m.

Carla Mary and Paul Roux, Woodard & Curran

Others present: Shirley Winslow and Rose Thibault

C. Mary reported that the cost for lighting strike in September is up to \$16,000 and this does not include labor. An insurance claim is being filed.

C. Mary told the Board that DES and EPA has a new method of e-coli testing that will need to be done. There will be additional cost associated with these new testing methods.

C. Mary showed the Board a dvd of the camering of 84 Mill Street. It shows roots in the pipe and a large flow of water. The repairs will need to be on the owners' property. It was discussed how this will be handled and who will pay for the repairs. No decision was made at this time.

C. Mary inquired about obtaining the fire truck that was put out to bid. As there were no bids submitted she would like to have that truck for use by the water and wastewater departments. After discussion on how to handle the funding it was decided that Woodard & Curran will look into purchasing the vehicle from the town. They will get back to the Board after it has been determined what repairs are need to be done before it can go on the road.

Wastewater and Water 2008 Budgets

Budget Committee Members present: Shirley Winslow, Rose Thibault and Ted deWinter.

Wastewater Budget was reviewed with a final budget of \$331,842 approved. Water Budget was reviewed with a final budget of \$206,846.

Discussion was held on the cleaning of the lagoons at the water treatment plant. It was agreed to put a warrant article in 2008 in the amount of \$40,000 to have this done. It was also agreed to set up an Expendable Trust for collection system maintenance and repairs where the receipts from the sewer ties in would be placed for maintenance and repairs. A starting amount of \$5,000 to be placed into this fund. Pump station repairs were discussed and the need for up to \$20,000 for repairing the 4 pumps. It was agreed to place this on the warrant. C. Mary requested funds to purchase a jetter system. Board asked her to get more firm prices and come back to them after for more discussion. She also requested funds to have a structure put up at the water treatment facility to house lime feed and storage. Board asked her to look into other forms of structures and get more prices.

Charles Santich, Joe LaRouche and Lester Rheume of Pilgrim Foods

C. Santich told the Board that something needs to be done about the speed limit on Old Wilton Road before there is another fatality. He is concerned about his workers there as well. C. Santich told the Board that he will to assist the town in any cost associated with making this road safer for travel, such as a speed bump. D. Bouley asked C. Santich to attend the next Joint Police Meeting where this can be discussed with Chief McTague. The next meeting is December 10 in Greenville. C. Santich said that he will attend that meeting.

C. Santich told the Board that he is billed for 8,000 gallons per month for domestic sewer. This amount is written down on their month flow reports submitted to the town. This was not reported correctly and should be 800 gallons per month. He told the Board that the maximum number of employees he has there at a time is 50 and they could not use 8,000 gallons to flush the toilets. The only sewerage that goes to the town is from the toilets, the sinks and other domestic waste goes to their lagoons. Board stated that a meter should be placed on the line. C. Santich told them all plumbing is now in the walls of the building and would be nearly impossible to attaché a meter. It was agreed that Carla and Lester would meet next Thursday to look at what can be done and the best solution. Their findings will be reported back to the Board and then the Board will advise C. Santich of their decision.

Charles Santich discussed with the Board the Industrial Discharge Permit that needs to be renewed January 1, 2008. He would like to see the BOD and TSS levels increased for the winter months as the amounts in the permit are hard for him to meet during those times. He stated that if the town cannot adjust these numbers he will have to stop discharging during the winter months. Cara Mary stated that she will need to look at the numbers required by the State for the towns permit before she can give them any numbers. She will do so and report back to the Board.

Tirrelli's Property – Pleasant Street

Donald Baldinelli submitted new photos of Tirrelli's property on Pleasant Street showing that there are still a number of vehicles on the property. Board gave him one month to clean up the property and he has been working on it. D. Bouley suggested that a letter be sent to him reminding him that he needs to address this issue. No decision was made.

Memo from Chief McTague – Police Station Doors

Board received a memo from Chief McTague requesting permission to proceed with a quote from Raynor Door Authority to have the garage door to the police station replaced. He also stated that he would need assistance from the Highway Department to reframe the casing for the doors. Board stated that they want to have a quote from a carpenter for the framing of the door, the Highway Department is not allowed to do the work. Linda will send a memo to Chief McTague.\

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Parking Vehicles on Sidewalks

Linda gave the Board correspondence she received from Attorney Mullins in reference to vehicles parking on sidewalks in town. He advised that these vehicles be ticketed as they are in violation of RSA 31:122 and RSA 47:17, VII. Board voted to establish an ordinance that no parking is allowed on sidewalks in the Town of Greenville, any found will be ticketed. This will be effective January 1, 2008.

Souhegan Valley Ambulance Service Board of Directors

Board received request from the Board of Directors for nomination of Greenville's representatives. Board will send a letter nominating Daryl Fournier, Roland Vaillancourt and Mike Washburn as Greenville's Representatives.
