

Greenville Board of Selectmen
Minutes of the Public Meeting
April 9, 2008

Members present: Scott Blease, Kathy Washburn, Brenda Bergeron

Meeting opened at 6:30 pm

Linda Huszar – treasurer position

Linda Huszar applied for the position of treasurer. Board reviewed her application. She told the Board that she was willing to give it a try. The books will be brought up to April 1, 2008 by the auditors, she will not be accountable for anything prior to that date. Board signed her appointment until March 2009 elections.

Motion made by B. Bergeron to authorize the Cen-Com purchase order for communication equipment in the amount of \$5,069 with the funds to be withdrawn from the communications expendable trust fund, second by K. Washburn. Motion passed. Scott requested that a memo be sent to the Fire Chief that the radios being replaced be brought to the town hall.

Carla Mary & Paul Roux – Woodard & Curran

Paul Roux and Carla Mary discussed with the Board the meeting that Paul Roux had with Charles Santich at Pilgrim Foods at their plant concerning their violations with the discharge from the lagoons to the wastewater plant.

84 Mill Street repairs needed – Carla Mary updated the Board of the cost associated with these repairs. She received a quote from Dean Card in the amount of \$1,500. Board will work on setting a policy.

Sludge Holding Tank repairs – Carla updated the Board as to where we stand with this project. She told the Board that she has received pricing of \$11,300 for the planks and wanted permission from the Board to order them. Motion made by B. Bergeron to allow Carla Mary to move forward with the project of the sludge holding tanks, second by K. Washburn. Motion carried.

Draft permit from the State for the wastewater plant was submitted to the board. There will still be a permit from EPA coming. C. Mary wanted them to note on page 7 and 8 are all new to the town and will need to be addressed. This work all focuses on the I&I that the town is working on.

Donald Baldinelli – building permit officer

Donald Baldinelli reviewed with the Board cease and desist orders that need to be issued to residents in town. Board reviewed them, signed them and will have them hand delivered by the police department tomorrow, April 10, 2008.

Senator Peter Bragdon – NH Retirement System & Education Funding

Senator Bragdon discussed with the Board the NH Retirement System, he feels that this will pass the Senate as presented. He explained what is going on with the system and the cost that could be placed on towns, with additional cost of \$18,000 per year over the next few years. Also discussed was the education funding and where Greenville has lost a substantial amount. He strongly suggested that the board members let the State Reps know to vote this bill down.

Charles Santich – Pilgrim Foods

Charles Santich was in to discuss his water and wastewater bills. C. Santich said that he wants to have a meter put on his domestic sewer so that he can be billed accurately. Board agreed to have the meter installed as soon as possible. C. Santich asked for an abatement on the sewer bill. K. Washburn stated that they would keep his request for an abatement and request that Carla Mary install a meter at Pilgrim Foods as soon as possible, the cost of the meter and installation is to be paid by Pilgrim Foods per the Greenville Sewer Ordinance. Motion made by K. Washburn to ask Carla to revisit the current water and sewer bills for Pilgrim Foods and for input on a meter and the cost associated with it, second by S. Blease. Motion passed. Board will get back to him with their decision. C. Santich stated that as this is private property he would like to be notified of when she is going to be on their property, preferably a day or two notice. A copy of a letter the Board received from Carla Mary concerning the meter was given to Charles Santich.

Charles Santich said that they feel they and the town are subsidizing Greenville Estates and that they are not paying their fair share for wastewater. K. Washburn said that there is an agreement with Greenville Estates on the basis that Greenville Estates paid for the wastewater system at their end, for the tie-in to the town system and the upgrade to the wastewater plant. It was a substantial amount that they had to pay and this was an advantage for the town to have the line on Route 31.

Charles Santich said that he would also like to have some time to meet with the Board to discuss the wastewater permit with the town. Board agreed. He was told that Carla Mary stated tonight that she is waiting for information from EPA and DES before finalizing the permit.

Scott Blease asked to have the town hall area swept.

Elderly and Veterans Exemptions

Board reviewed the renewal of elderly and veterans exemptions and signed them.

Junk Yard License Renewal

Board received a junk yard renewal application from Burton Lashua. Board approved the renewal and signed it.

Motion made by B. Bergeron to adjourn the meeting at 10:05 p.m., second by K. Washburn. Motion carried and meeting adjourned.
