

Greenville Board of Selectmen
Minutes of the Public Meeting
November 12, 2008

Members present: Scott Blease, Kathy Washburn, Brenda Bergeron

Meeting opened at 7:00 p.m.

Highway Department 2009 Budget

Present: Dennis Heywood, Road Agent, Budget Committee Members – Tom Barrett, Rose Thibault, Rick Miller and Shirley Winslow

Highway Department 2009 requested budget was reviewed. It was agreed that the salaries line item would show the total annual amount paid to Dennis Heywood, Mike Bergeron and Gregg Eastman. In prior years a portion of their salaries were divided into the Parks & Recreation and Cemetery Budgets. These budgets will now have the salary line items for maintenance removed. Flood insurance line item was increased to \$1,300 and Labor Administration was increased to \$2,200. Discussion was held on reducing the line item for highway maintenance to \$20,000 for this year but Brenda Bergeron suggested that they wait until we find out how much the town will receive in Highway Block Grant., all agreed.

D. Heywood stated that he would like to finish insulating the highway barn for an approximate cost of \$1,100. Board agreed to allow him to do this work and to take the funds from the highway shop supplies line item. He also told the board that while insulating he will need to take the lights down, which are very old, he would like to replace them at the same time. Scott Blease told him that he could probably find the lights at Lowes for about \$15 each. Board told D. Heywood that he could replace the lights if he could find them at a low enough cost.

Norman Brown – Pitcherville

Norman Brown was asked to come to a meeting to discuss noise, hours of operation and excavating at the Pitcherville site on Route 31. Mr. Brown told the Board that there was one incident on a Sunday evening where a vehicle was loaded and the employee was told that this could not happen again. K. Washburn told them that the Planning Board minutes stated no operations before 6 a.m. Mr. Brown explained that the hours of operation stated at that meeting were the operations of the facility not the hours that would trucks would start and leave the area. He told the Board that he has trucks leave at 4:30 a.m. but not more than 1 or 2 trucks three times per week. Justin Severance of 706 Fitchburg Road was present at this meeting and stated that he also abuts the Pitcherville property and has no problems with their operations, they are very respectful of their neighbors. Mr. Brown explained that they are down from 20 trucks to 9 trucks operating right now. Two trucks do load up in Wilton in the afternoon and then park at the Route 31 site in Greenville to leave early in the morning. The site in Wilton does not open until 6 am and has up to 20 trucks waiting to be loaded. This does not give the driver enough

time to get to their delivery site 2 hours away for 7 am. Board asked that Mr. Brown speak with his employees and stress with them the importance of being considerate of the neighbors and the hours they are operating the trucks. He told the Board that they have regular meetings and he will discuss this matter with them at his next meeting.

Board asked Mr. Brown if he was excavating any materials at this site. The Board was told that they are only excavating what needs to be done to set up the site, which is allowed by law. They have 3 sites on this property, 2 have been completed and they are finishing up the 3rd site.

Nonpublic Session scheduled for 8:30 pm was not held as the individual requesting the appointment cancelled at 8 pm.

E911 Mapping

L. Langille explained to the Board a letter that was emailed to her concerning the E911 mapping update. They are looking for the Board to sign off on the updates that they completed on the town maps. These maps have streets with duplicate names and incorrect numbering, all of which the Board will need to address. Board agreed to have L. Langille continue to work on this project and begin setting up public hearings in 2009 on the changes to the street names.

Comcast

Board received a letter from David Orgaz concerning the fact that he cannot receive internet service from Comcast as one resident on the street will not allow them access to the telephone pole. L. Langille told the Board that she also spoke with a woman on Monday evening that has the same request and was told by her that there are six residents along that area that also would like to have the service. Board authorized L. Langille to contact Comcast, PSNH, FairPoint and DOT to see if something can worked out so that these residents can get the service.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Generator

Board received a letter from Carla Mary concerning the generator at the Wastewater Treatment plant. They called C. Mary and requested she come to the meeting to discuss this further. C. Mary attended the meeting and discussed with the Board the options in replacing the generator and renting a generator until a new one can be delivered. Board agreed to allow C. Mary to continue to look into prices for a new generator and submit that to the Board. They will decide at the next meeting how to fund the cost of the generator. The Board also agreed to have C. Mary rent a generator until the new one can be delivered.
