## ORDINANCE

## NUMBER 92-09

## PARADE PERMIT

This ordinance is by order of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Greenville, New Hampshire in accordance with Chapter 41:11, of the Revised Statutes Annotated.

SECTION A: No person, group or organization shall hold a parade on any public way or public sidewalk without first obtaining a permit from the Board of Selectmen.

SECTION B: A parade is defined as any act or acts which block, impede or disrupt the flow of traffic on a public way, or blocks or impedes person or persons from using the sidewalk.

SECTION C: Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to limit or restrict citizens rights under the constitutions of the United States or the State of New Hampshire, in as much as they conform to section "B" of this ordinance.

SECTION D: Any person, group or organization shall apply for a permit from the Board of Selectmen Office not less than fourteen (14) day prior to the event. Said person, group or organization shall fill out required form with all requested information. The Board of Selectmen shall, prior to seventy two (72) hours of the date of the event, review the permit. The Board will consider police and emergency service costs, the effect on the community as well as any hazards the event would cause.

SECTION E: If the Board of Selectmen approves the permit, within twenty four hours a signed copy will be given to the following; Fire Chief, Police Chief, Head of the Ambulance Service, Head of the Highway Department and the person, group or organization which requested the permit. In addition the Board will outline to the department heads the degree of support they are to give to the permit recipient.

SECTION F: If the Board of Selectmen denies the permit, they shall notify the effected person, group or organization of their decision within twenty four (24) hours. Said person, group or organization may appeal to the Board providing such appeal is taken within forty eight (48) hours of the denial. The Board of Selectmen will hold a hearing as soon as possible on the appeal. If after the hearing, the permit is still denied, the party involved will be notified of the decision within twenty four hours. The Board of Selectmen will notify the Chief of Police of all denied permits.

SECTION G: Anyone who does not have a valid permit from the Eoard of Selectmen and violates section "B" of this ordinance shall be guilty of a violation.
