REGULATIONS CONCERNING PUBLIC WAYS & LOITERING

By order of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Greenville, in accordance with Chapter 105, Sections 6-7-8, Revised Statutes Annotated of 1955, no vehicle shall be left standing from the hours of 9:00 P.M. to 6:00 A.M. on the westerly side of Main Street from the intersection of Main Street and High Street to a point one hundred feet north along Main Street from said intersection.

Anyone convicted of violating the above ordinance shall be guilty of a violation.

REGULATIONS CONCERNING PUBLIC WAYS & LOITERING

By order of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Greenville, in accordance with Chapter 4, Section 11 and Chapter 47, Section 17, both as amended, Revised Statutes Annotated of 1955, the following ORDINANCE for the Town of Greenville is hereby enacted:

1. Three or more persons shall not stand in a group nor near each other on any sidewalk, street, bridge or entrance to a public building, so as to obstruct free passage of pedestrians or motor vehicles, and any person so obstructing the sidewalk, street, bridge, or entrance shall move immediately after a request to move is made by any police officer.
2. No person shall sit, stand or lounge in or about the doors or passageways to any store, church, public park, public playground or public building, office, dwelling house, or apartment house, except the owner or tenant thereof, after having been requested to depart therefrom by the owner, tenant, proprietor or any police officer.
3. There will be no loitering allowed around Mascenic School District Property, or any town building, neither inside nor on the adjacent premises or parking areas, nor on any bridge or bridge abutment nor fences within the Village area, either by persons standing, sitting or in a motor vehicle unless engaged in official business or work in or on said premises.

Anyone convicted of violating any of the provisions of the above ordinance shall be guilty of a violation.
